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HSE Cultural and Art Camp

The HSE Cultural Art Camp is an initiative of the Wetland Cultural and Education Foundation. It takes place during the summer holidays and aims to pass across values to its participants (Senior Secondary School students) and volunteers (University Students).

For a period of ten days, the participants either go in-depth in appreciating their Nigerian heritage through the viewpoint of Arts and culture at the Yemisi Shyllon Museum of Art, or hone their skills in media and publicity with classes offered by the School of Media and Communication, Pan-Atlantic University.

Opportunities for parents of select participants to assist in some of the get-togethers are also provided to enable that this formation is made complete with this familial undertone.

In addition, the camp provides an atmosphere for development of virtues and mastering of emotions through various seminars on morals, values, and other activities that will help the participants forge a sturdy character. Select volunteers—from different parts of the country, assist with the camp's daily activities with a chance to improving their spirit of service.

Finally, Opus Dei, an institution of the Catholic Church, is entrusted with the spiritual and moral activities of the camp.

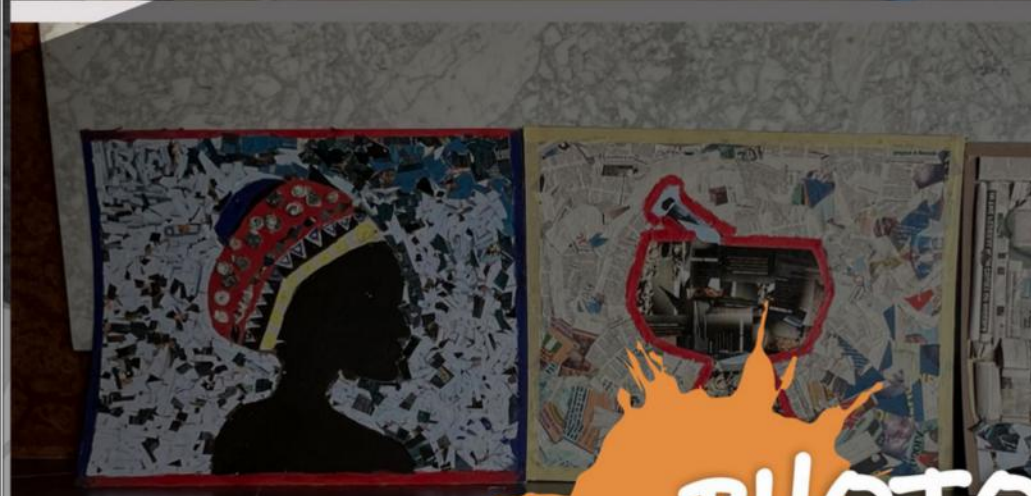

MOBILE VIDEOGRAPHY SESSIONS

PRE-PRODUCTION/ PRODUCTION AND POST PRODUCTION STAGES

The participants engaged in the theoretical sessions of the mobile videography course. Here, they learned various concepts and techniques such as lighting, shot composition, shot sizes, camera movement during a scene, the types of stories, camera angles, etc.

In the practical mobile videography sessions, they used the previously mentioned knowledge and techniques to build their creative writing skills. Using various applications as part of the pre-and post-production stage of making a film, they developed compelling stories adapted from everyday life. 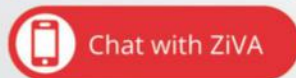
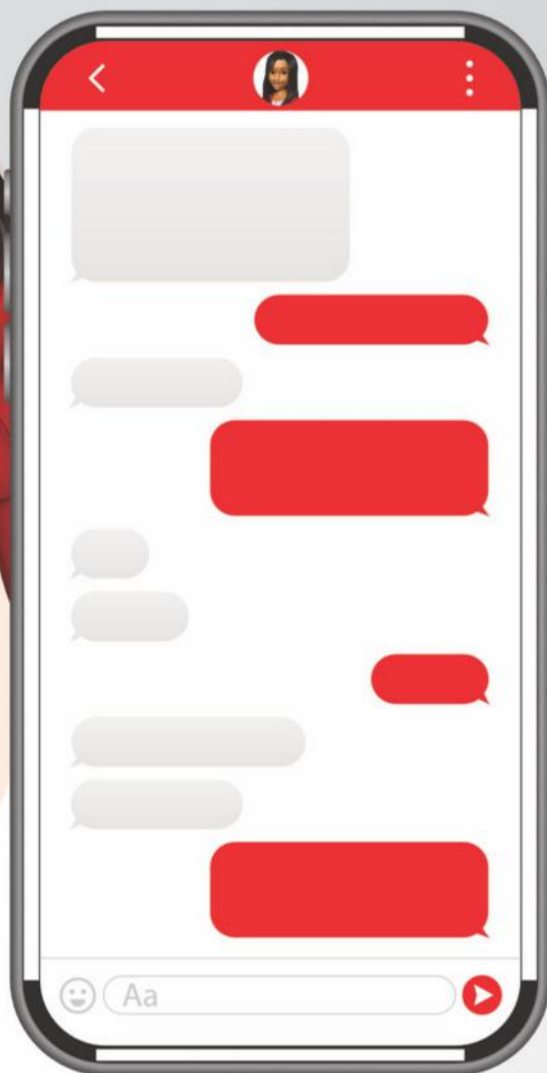
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
